Brian Campbell is a Montreal poet, editor, singer-songwriter, translator, photographer, book reviewer and chapbook publisher. His third full-length collection, *Shimmer Report*, was published in 2015 by Ekstasis Editions. Brian Campbell is also the author of *Remnants of Autumn* (Sky of Ink Press, 2016), *A Private Collection* (Sky of Ink Press, 2014), *Passenger Flight* (Signature Editions, 2009), *Guatemala and Other Poems* (Window Press, Toronto, 1994), and *Undressing the Night*, his book-length translation of the selected poems of the Nicaraguan-Canadian poet Francisco Santos (Editorial Lunes, Costa Rica, 2006). Campbell's poems have appeared in numerous literary reviews in Canada, the U.S., and Europe; one was chosen by the British Columbia Ministry of Education for use on its provincial high school exam. He was a finalist in the 2006 CBC Literary Award for Poetry. In 2011, he was a recipient of a Canada Council creative writing grant towards the completion of *Shimmer Report*.

On This Shore, an EP of five songs and a poem, was released digitally and on CD in 2020; The Courtier's Manuscript, a full-length CD of fourteen songs and a poem, was released in 2002, and The Imaginary Album, a solo cassette, in 1996.

BLOG

Born in Toronto, Canada, Brian Campbell graduated (with distinction) with an Honours B.A. in English, University of Toronto, 1980. He completed a Diploma in Education at McGill University, Montreal, 1991. From 1991 until his retirement in 2015, Brian Campbell taught English Language Acquisition at McGill English Montreal School Board. He also did freelance commercial translation from French to English. Campbell now dedicates himself full-time to his art.
